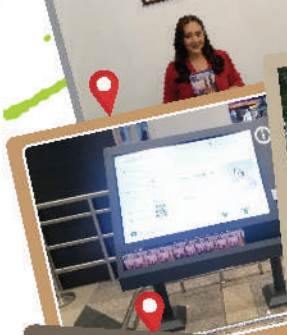
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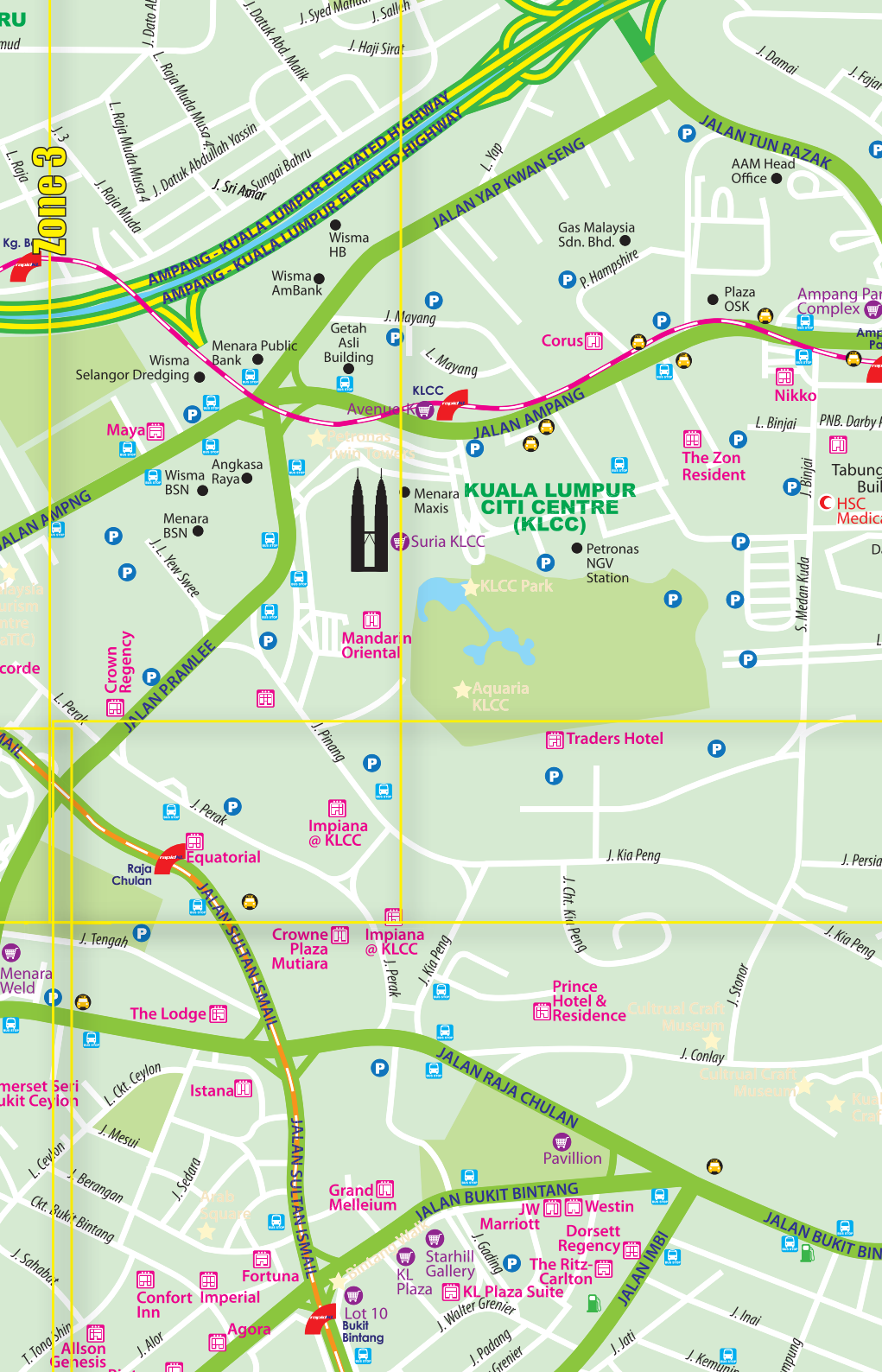


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MAP OF KUALA LUMPUR

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Ways To Get to KL City Centre by Air

From KLIA & KLIA 2

KLIA Express and KLIA Transit train with the duration of 35 mins and the fare would be between RM 35 - RM55. Current frequency is every 3 hours.

The Airport Coach bus will cost around RM10 and operating hours are from 12.30am to 11.30pm.

Aerobus operating hours are 6.45am until 6.45pm and fare starts from RM14.

Taxis are quite expensive. The fare starts from RM74 and with family it's around RM200.

Grab would cost around RM65 to RM75 for 40 to 45 minutes of journey.

From Subang Skypark Terminal

Skypark Link train will cost around RM10 from Subang Airport to Kuala Lumpur Sentral.

Jet Bus operating hours are from 9am to 7.15pm with a duration of 20 to 30 minutes depending on the traffic. The fare starts from RM10 to Kuala Lumpur.

JetBus operating hours are from 10.30am to 9.30pm with a duration of 20 to 30 minutes depending on the traffic. The fare starts from RM10 to Kuala Lumpur.

Grabcar would cost between RM24 to RM27 to KL Sentral which can be arrived in 20 minutes.

From Penang International Airport

Flights from Penang Airport to KLIA Airport or Subang Airport airport will take around 1 hour with the fare starting from RM70 to RM650.

Bus is the cheapest option with the fare starting from RM50 to RM60. However the duration will be around 7 hours plus.

Driving from Penang to Kuala Lumpur will take around 4 to 5 hours depends on the traffic and the approximate fuel costs will be RM79 to RM113

From Kuching International Airport

Flight from Kuching International Airport to KLIA Airport duration is approximately 1 hour 44 minutes depending on the types of flights, AirAsia, Malindo Air or Malaysia Airlines. Then, take KLIA Express from the airport to Kuala Lumpur Sentral. Starting fare from RM160 - RM650.

Flight from Kuching to Subang Airport duration is 5 hours 35 minutes and take a bus from Kuala Lumpur. Starting fare from RM289 - RM581.

From Langkawi International Airport

Flight from Langkawi International Airport to KLIA Airport duration is approximately 1 hour 1 minutes depending on the types of flights, AirAsia, Malindo Air or Malaysia Airlines. Starting fare from RM160 - RM200.

Flight from Langkawi to Subang Airport duration is 58 minutes and take a bus to Kuala Lumpur. Starting fare from RM119 - RM176.

From Kota Kinabalu International Airport

Flight from Kota Kinabalu International Airport (KKIA) to KLIA Airport duration is approximately 2 hour 25 minutes depending on the types of flights, AirAsia, Malindo Air or Malaysia Airlines. Starting fare to RM380 - RM1378.

Flight from Kota Kinabalu International Airport to Subang Airport duration is 2 hour 25 minutes and take a bus to Kuala Lumpur. Starting fare from RM289 - RM581.

Express Train

One of the fastest modes of transportation to travel to and from the airport is the KLIA Ekspres that takes approximately 25 to 35 minutes. However, the ticket price is quite costly, starting from RM 55 per pax for a one way ticket. The express train travels between International Airports (KLIA and KLIA2) to KL Sentral. You may purchase the train ticket online or head to its main station at KL Sentral. The service provides a free porter service at respective platforms and also high speed WiFi onboard. Alternatively, you can hitch a ride on the less expensive but non-direct route trains such as the KTM, MRT, LRT and Monorail.

Bus

Buses are just about the cheapest mode of transportation to get from the airport to the city and vice versa. They are relatively safe and fairly comfortable, made up of a fleet of 44-seated air conditioned coaches. The fare is quite affordable; from RM 12 to RM 15 per pax, depending on your pick up station. Therefore, the journey to and from the airport to the respective bus station may vary. However, the standard



Taxi

Taxis are not exactly known to have a good reputation in Malaysia. Most locals typically avoid using taxis due to their high rates and non-standardized usage of meter and tracking. Therefore, taxis are not a very popular mode of transportation, but if passengers have no other choice, it is advisable to ask the driver beforehand if they can use the provided meter to get to a specific destination. Generally, the fare is estimated to be around RM3 for the first kilometre with RM0.20 added for every subsequent 150 meters. The journey can last for about 1 to 2 hours but keep in mind that this varies in both location and traffic.

E-hailing service

As one of the most popular modes of transportation in Malaysia, the E-hailing service has caught the attention of both locals and visitors due to its high reliability and access through its user-friendly mobile app, making it one of the fastest ways to get to a specific destination provided that the traffic is minimal. One of the best reasons to use the E-hailing service is the transparent and fixed fares made clear even before you make a booking. Passengers are also covered with accident insurance the moment they enter a



Kuala Lumpur at a Glance



KL AT GLANCE

Kuala Lumpur, or the abbreviated referral term simply known as 'KL', is Malaysia's national capital and largest city. It is formally known as the Federal Territory of Kuala Lumpur. On top of that, it is known as the capital of Malaysia. In terms of population and economic growth, it is one of Southeast Asia's rapidly expanding urban areas. Kuala Lumpur is Malaysia's cultural, financial, and economic capital, the home of the Malaysian Parliament and the Istana Negara, the official palace of the Malaysian King (referred to by the title of Yang di-Pertuan Agong).

This metropolitan concrete jungle is included as one of Malaysia's three Federal Territories, enclaved inside the state of Selangor on Peninsular Malaysia's central west coast. This beautiful city has hosted several international sports, political, and cultural events throughout the 1990s, notably the 1998 Commonwealth Games. Kuala Lumpur has grown rapidly in recent decades, and it is currently the world's ninth most visited city.

5 Must-Know Facts About KL

1 Kuala Lumpur was not a city until 1972

Despite being one of the world's fastest-growing cities, Kuala Lumpur was only established as a city in 1972. Kuala Lumpur was managed by a single company known as the Federal Capital Commissioner, after which administrative responsibility was passed to the Lord Mayor (Datuk Bandar)

2 Home to the National Palace

Also referred to as 'Istana Negara', The National Palace in Kuala Lumpur is the Yang Di-Pertuan Agong's official home. It is considered to be Malaysia's equivalent of England's famous Buckingham Palace. However, the magnificent palace, which covers around 50,000 square metres, is a popular tourist destination that has been turned into a royal museum.

3 Hosted the 1998 Commonwealth Games

Back in 1998, Kuala Lumpur was honoured as the hosting country of the 1998 Commonwealth Games. Although it became the one and only time the international event was held here, it brought glory to the country's name.

4 Houses the tallest telecommunication tower in Southeast Asia

Another historically famous landmark that has earned the international title of being the tallest telecommunication tower in Southeast Asia is the KL Tower. Also locally referred to as Menara KL, this seventh tallest telecommunication tower in the world stands at 421 metres high.

5 A Brazilian architect designed the majestic KLCC Park

The one and only beautiful KLCC Park is a 50-acre public park developed in close proximity to the Suria KLCC shopping centre. It was designed by Roberto Burle Marx, a Brazilian landscape architect who was a fan of water gardens. This may explain the creation of the 10,000sqm manmade Lake Symphony with a cross-over bridge.



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History of Kuala Lumpur

Kuala Lumpur became the capital of the province of Selangor in 1887. The city was already known as Kuala Lumpur, which meant 'Muddy Confluence' at the time. This is the result of the confluence of the two rivers Gombak and Klang. These rivers served as the city's main entry points.

19th century : Sumatrans may have settled in the upper reaches of Klang River

1840 : Chinese miners were involved in tin mining up the Selangor River

1857 : Once Kuala Lumpur became established as a town, the miners arrived in Kuala Lumpur and proceeded on foot to Ampang, where the first mine was established. 87 tin miners found rich sources of tin.

1862 : As a result of the influx of new miners from all over the world, there are numerous disputes and gang warfare.

1869 : Yap Ah Loy became the leader of the Chinese community of Kuala Lumpur, and in just a few years, he established peace and order in the city. He had the greatest influence in Kuala Lumpur, he founded Kuala Lumpur's first school and a destitute refuge.

1880: British envoy Frank Swettenham creates the first city plan for Kuala Lumpur, transforming it into a modern metropolis.

1881: Kuala Lumpur was a small city with numerous social and political issues. The town's buildings were made of wood, which were prone to fire, and there was a constant threat of flooding due to a lack of proper sanitation.

1886: Swettenham also pushed the construction of a railway line between Klang and Kuala Lumpur, which improved access to Kuala Lumpur and accelerated the town's expansion, resulting in the town's fast expansion.

1890: The population was 4,500, and by 1890, it had risen to 20,000. As growth accelerated, cleanliness, waste disposal, and other health concerns became more pressing. On May 14, 1890, a Sanitary Board was established, which was in charge of cleanliness, road maintenance, street lighting, and other duties

1896: The Sultans of four states have united to form the Federated Malay States. Kuala Lumpur becomes the Federated Malay States' capital.

Greater Kuala Lumpur encompasses the region west of the Federal Territory of Kuala Lumpur to Port Klang, east to the Titiwangsa Mountains, and north and south to the Titiwangsa Mountains. The Klang Valley Integrated Transit System serves the area, which includes administratively independent towns and cities such as Klang, Shah Alam, Putrajaya, and others. The construction of a new Kuala Lumpur City Centre around Jalan Ampang and the Petronas Towers are two notable projects in Kuala Lumpur.

1942: During World War II, Kuala Lumpur was captured by the Imperial Japanese Army on 11 January 1942 to 15 August 1945. The "3 years and 8 months" period nearly brought Kuala Lumpur's economy to a halt.

1946: Kuala Lumpur becomes capital in the Federation of Malaya.

1957: After 151 years of British rule, Malaysia declares independence on August 31. Kuala Lumpur became the capital of the Independent Federation of Malaya.

1963: Kuala Lumpur becomes capital of Malaysia

1972: Kuala Lumpur was awarded city status, making it the first town in Malaysia to do so after independence.

1974: Kuala Lumpur later became a federal territory on February 1

1978: The city of Shah Alam was proclaimed the new state capital in, Kuala Lumpur ceased to be the capital of Selangor

1990: Kuala Lumpur commemorated its 100th year of local government on May 14/

1999: The federal administrative capital of Malaysia moves to Putrajaya.

2007: Kuala Lumpur celebrates its 50th year as capital of Malaysia and Malaysia its 50th year of independence

National Palace

Malaysia's National Palace is known as Istana Negara. The 13-acre castle, which was built in 1928 and is located along Jalan Istana. It was formerly the official home of Malaysia's Yang di-Pertuan Agong (King). The National Palace was demolished in June 2011 to make way for a new, opulent RM800 million mansion near Kuala Lumpur's Jalan Duta.

Historical Sites

Kuala Lumpur Railway Station

The Kuala Lumpur Railway Station is a Moorish-style structure that seems like something out of a dream. It was KL's primary railway hub until 2001, when Kuala Lumpur Sentral took over much of its responsibility. It was created by A.B. Hubbock in 1910, and it combines Eastern and Western influences. The Malaya Railway Administration Building, also constructed by Hubbock in 1917, lies just across the street.

Vivekananda Ashrama

The Vivekananda Ashrama in Kuala Lumpur was founded in 1904 by Tamil immigrants from Jaffna (Sri Lanka) to honour Swami Vivekananda. The structure, which was built in 1908, is devoted to his efforts to provide education and spiritual growth to the community's youngsters. Vivekananda is currently run by an elected Management Committee.

Old General Post Office

The most stunning post office ever erected, it was completed in 1907 and designed by A.B. Hubbock, a British architect who created many of Kuala Lumpur's structures at the time. The General Post Office in Kuala Lumpur is Malaysia's largest. The facility opened in 1985 in the Dayabumi Complex. Pos Malaysia oversees the operation.

Old Market Square Clock Tower

This clock tower can be found at Medan Pasar's main square. The clock tower was created in 1937, while Malaysia was still part of the British Empire, to honour King George IV's coronation. With its soaring lines of the tower and sharp clear lines of sun rays on the wooden panelling, the design is nearly Art Deco.

Oriental Building

The Oriental Building is located at the corner of Jalan Tun Perak and Jalan Melaka. Between the early 1930s and the 1940s, the Art Deco architectural style gained prominence and became the favoured option of building owners in Malaysia, particularly in major cities such as Kuala Lumpur, Penang, and Ipoh. Art Deco architecture was popular globally from 1925, following World War I, through the early 1940s, when style began to fade after WWII.

Abu Seman Chief House

One of the oldest remaining traditional Malay residences is the Abu Seman Chief House. It was owned by the local headman of Mukim Bagan Samak, Bandar Baharu, Kedah, and was built in phases between 1910 and the early 1930s. Badan Warisan Malaysia rescued, transported, and rebuilt it at Kampung Sungai Kechil, a tiny town in the northern part of Peninsula Malaysia, between 1996 and 1997.

Loke Mansion

The Exchange 106

The Exchange 106 is a skyscraper in the Tun Razak Exchange region of Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, which is now being built as a new financial centre. The 95-story structure is crowned by a 65-meter-high, 12-story-high lit crown, making it 445.5 metres tall. The net lettable area of the skyscraper will be 240,000 square metres. It shoots outward, filled with light and creativity, producing a stunning silhouette that brings out the building's full grandeur.

Petaling Street

Colourful Cultures of Malaysia



Malaysia has a diverse population. The Malays, as well as considerable communities of Chinese and Indians, make up the primary ethnic groupings. When travelling around the nation, it is evident that the ethnic groups have kept their beliefs, customs, and way of life. Public holidays are the most important holidays for each group.

Malaysia's culture is influenced by the many cultures of Malaysia's various ethnic groups. Indigenous tribes were the first to settle in the area, and they were followed by the Malays, who arrived in ancient times from mainland Asia. When commerce with those nations began, Chinese and Indian cultural influences became more pronounced, which grew in tandem with Malaysian immigration. Persia, Arabic, and the British are examples of other civilizations that have influenced Malaysia. With some overlap, Malaysia's diverse ethnic groups each have their own distinct cultural identities.

In public and private, Malays, Chinese, and Indians all endeavour too. We avoid disgrace and keep the peace. Face is a notion that encompasses attributes such as having a good name, having excellent character, and being respected by one's peers. Face is regarded as a valuable asset that may be given, lost, taken away, or gained. This face also includes the family, school, company, and even the whole country.

Get to Know The People

Malay

The Malays are from various sections of the peninsula and Southeast Asia's archipelago. They account for over half of the country's total population, are the most influential political group, and are numerically dominating on the peninsula. The Malays who live near the peninsula's southern tip and those who live along the peninsula's eastern and western coasts have the most noticeable cultural variations. Malays are legally defined in part by their allegiance to a certain faith, Islam, unlike the other ethnic groups in Malaysia. Their main festival is Hari Raya Aidilfitri and Hari Raya Aidil Adha.

Chinese

The Chinese, who make up nearly a fourth of Malaysia's population, originated in southern China. They are linguistically more diversified than the Malays, speaking a variety of Chinese languages in Peninsular Malaysia, the most important of which being Hokkien and Hainanese, which are Southern Min languages, as well as Cantonese, and Hakka. The Chinese New Year is Malaysia's most important Chinese festival.



Indian

South Asians, including Indians, Pakistanis, and Sri Lankans, make up a tiny but important component of Malaysia's population. Speakers of Dravidian languages such as Tamil, Telugu, Malayalam, and others, as well as speakers of Indo-European languages such as Punjabi, Bengali, Pashto, Ceylonese and Sinhalese, can be split linguistically. Tamil speakers make up the majority of the population. Deepavali is Malaysia's most colourful festival. Hindus celebrate the occasion by drawing patterns and figures on the ground using coloured chalk and spreading coloured rice.

Orang Asli

Orang Asli, often known as native people, is a Malaysian national minority made up of a diverse indigenous population. They are Peninsular Malaysia's oldest residents. Along with the Malays, Chinese, Indians, and indigenous East Malaysians of Sabah and Sarawak, the Orang Asli form a unique group. Their unique status is codified in law. Orang Asli villages may be found across the nation, especially among the country's Malay people, typically in hilly places or the jungles of the rainforest.



Cultural Festivals



Thaipusam

The Tamils celebrate one of their most important festivals in late January or early February, when the moon is full. Thaipusam commemorates Murugan's victory against the wicked demon Soorapadman. Devotees pierce portions of their bodies, such as their cheeks and tongue, during this event. Some will carry Kavadi which is a decorative object used by devotees to pierce their bodies.

Dragon Boat Festival

Penang's greatest event, the Penang International Dragon Boat Festival, is a tourist favourite. Penang State Tourism hosts a yearly two-day event, which runs from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. More than 40 Malaysian and foreign racers compete in colourful traditional boats followed by drum beats at the Teluk Bahang Dam, which is located 18 kilometres from Georgetown.

Hungry Ghost Festival

On the 15th day of the 7th lunar month, the Hungry Ghost Festival is held. It is said that on this day, the "Gates of Hell" open, allowing the dead to see their surviving family. The Chinese believe that in order to obtain good fortune and luck in their life, people must appease the imprisoned and hungry spirits. Currently, events are held in homes, temples, organisations, and guilds to celebrate the occasion.

Nine Emperor Gods Festival

This nine-day Taoist festival, known as Ong Yeah, takes place on the eve of the Chinese lunar calendar's ninth month. This festival honours Tou Mu, the North Star Goddess who rules over life and death, and her nine sons. Believers wear white attire and do devotional activities such as fire walking during the celebration.

Pongal

The word pongal comes from the Tamil word pongu, which literally means "to boil over". During the four day celebration honouring the Surya, the sun God, sweet rice is a staple meal. In a clay pot, freshly harvested rice is cooked with fresh milk and topped with cashews, ghee and sugar. The milk flowing during the boiling is a sign of good fortune.

Lohri

Lohri is a harvest festival for the Punjabi people, similar to the exuberant celebrations of Vaisakhi. This festival is still observed in Malaysia, however by a smaller number of people. Local gurdwaras light a small bonfire and toss peanuts, candy, and grains into it. In addition, devotees get a 'prashad,' or devotional offering. Lohri, like every other Punjabi festival, is incomplete without singing and bhangra.



Traditional Dances of Malaysia

Dikir Barat

Dikir Barat combines Malay music, dance, and poetry in a unique way. It's commonly done at harvest time and at family gatherings. Dikir Barat is a comedic or satirical media for educating audiences, discussing important topics, and passing social commentary. The origins of this dance genre are claimed to be Malay communities in southern Thailand.

Plate Dance

As a fast-paced dance, plate dance or 'tarian piring' involves odd numbered dancers balancing these tableware on their palms. The movements are akin to that of farmers that are busy harvesting. As it is performed at wedding ceremonies, it ends with a bridal prayer after the trampling of the plates.

Sumazau

Sumazau is a traditional Malaysian folk dance that is very popular in Sabah. It is a Kadazan Dusun traditional dance. It is frequently done during the May harvest festival celebration. Sumazau is a traditional Japanese dance that is done in traditional black and crimson clothes. It is performed with the help of eagles, six gongs of varied sizes, and a drum with a distinct beat.



Bharatnatyam

Bharatnatyam is an artistic form of yoga that entails the graceful and artistic movement of body parts. It originated in Tamil Nadu and is the most commonly performed of Indian traditional dances in South India. S. Krishna Iyer coined the word Bharatnatyam in the mid-1930s, which was further popularised by Rukminidevi Arundale. Bharatanatyam is a combination of Bhava, Raga, Tala, and Natya.

Joget

Joget is a traditional Malaysian dance that is also a style of music that is frequently performed at cultural events and weddings. Branyo and Farapeira are two prominent Portuguese traditional dances that inspired it. This dance form, which has European roots, began in Malacca in the 16th century. Joget, which is also known as Chakunchak, can be performed without singing.

Mak Yong

Mak Yong is a traditional type of dance-drama that originated in northern Malaysia, namely the state of Kelantan. The Pan-Malaysian Islamic Party outlawed it due to its animist and Hindu-Buddhist roots, which predate Islam in Asia by centuries. Because it is mostly undisturbed by other influences, Mak Yong is regarded as the most authentic and representational of Malay performing arts.

Candle Dance

Translating to 'Tarian Lilin', Candle dance consists of female dancers gracefully dancing while ensuring a lighted candle placed atop a saucer does not fall from their cupped palm. Additionally, a ring is worn at the tip of each dancer's middle finger in order to tap the saucer in rhythm to the music.

Traditional Arts & Crafts

Nyonya Beaded Shoes

This Malaysian handicraft began in the Straits of Melaka and is associated with the Peranakan Community. Nyonya shoes, also known as Peranakan shoes or kasut manek in Malay, are an important aspect of Nyonya tradition. This artwork may be seen in a variety of settings, from ordinary home decor to more ornate pieces for special events such as weddings.

Pewterware

Malaysian pewter is a well-known alloy. Pewter artefacts are commonplace in Malaysian households, mostly as religious adornment. Its long-lasting glossy brilliance makes it appealing, and it has a glamorous and opulent appearance. Candle holders, keychains, bookmarks, dinnerware, and even accessories are made of pewter. Spirals are the most common designs.

Batik

Batik is one of the oldest types of craft in the world, and it is deeply rooted in Malay culture. Batik is a type of art that uses wax-resist dyeing processes to turn a plain white cloth into brilliant hues. Leaves and flowers are the most frequent themes. It is well-known for its geometrical patterns, particularly spirals.



Labu Sayong

A lustrous black Labu Sayong is a type of gourd-shaped jar made of fine clay. It is the forefather of Malaysia's ceramic industry. They are a testament to the potters' patience and show superb craftsmanship. Minor faults may be present because of the restricted materials used, but these flaws testify to the authenticity of the handcrafted jars. It's an old-fashioned water pitcher.

Pua Kumbu

Pua Kumbu is a traditional multi-colored patterned textile whose storey focuses on the mythical figures Mengginn and Dara Tinchin. All of the dye's basic components are sourced from rainforests. It is regarded as sacred by the Iban people and is customarily utilised by them. It is a symbol of material prosperity, social status, and prestige. Nature and their beliefs inspire the intricate designs.

Wau

Malaysian Wau Bulan is a speciality. In Malaysia, this crescent moon-shaped kite is a national emblem. Wau kites come in a variety of shapes, each with its own particular form. These kites are enormous in size, and their colours set them apart from the others. They are embellished with huge, brightly coloured motifs. The themes on the kites are mainly floral patterns, and they are embellished with paper tassels to make them more appealing.

National Mosque of Malaysia

Malaysia's National Mosque is a mosque in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. It can accommodate 15,000 people and is set in 13 acres of grounds. Nasi lemak is a Malay meal made out of aromatic rice cooked in coconut milk with pandan leaves. It is widely available in Malaysia, where it is regarded as the national dish.

Asam Laksa

In Southeast Asia, laksa is a spicy noodle meal. Laksa is made out of a variety of noodles, the most common of which are thick rice noodles, with various toppings such as chicken, prawns or even fish. A thick and spicy coconut soup or a broth seasoned with sour asam are used in most laksa varieties.

Rendang

Rendang is a Minang dish from the Minangkabau province of Indonesia's West Sumatra. It has made its way from Indonesian cuisine to the cuisines of Southeast Asian neighbours including Malaysia, Singapore, Brunei, and the Philippines.

nasi kerabu

Nasi kerabu, a form of nasi ulam, is a Malaysian rice dish in which blue-colored rice is served with dried fish or fried chicken, crackers, pickles, and other salads. The rice's blue hue comes from the petals of *Clitoria ternatea* flowers, which are utilised as a natural food colouring when it's cooked.

Satay

Satay, or sate in Indonesian and Malay spelling, is a seasoned, skewered, and grilled beef dish served with a sauce from Southeast Asia. Satay is said to have originated in Javanese cuisine, but it has now migrated to nearly every part of Malaysia, where it has become a national dish.

Char Kway Teow

Maritime Southeast Asia's char kway teow is a stir-fried Chinese-inspired rice noodle dish. Char means "stir-fried" in Hokkien, while kway teow refers to flat rice noodles.





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Must-try Eats in KL (Snack)

Apam balik

Apam balik, also known as terang bulan, martabak manis, or mǎnjīng, is a dessert sold at roadside booths in Brunei, Indonesia, Malaysia, and Singapore in a variety of flavours. Mǎnjīn is a homophone of Manang, which governed China's final imperial dynasty, and gu means pancake in Chinese.

Egg tarts

The egg tart is a custard tart that originated in Cantonese cuisine and is a cross between the English custard tart and the Portuguese pastel de nata. The dish is made up of an exterior pastry crust and an egg custard filling.

Curry puff

Curry puffs are a food that originated in Maritime Southeast Asia. It's a tiny pie with curry, chicken, and potatoes baked or deep-fried inside a pastry shell. To keep the curry from spilling out of the snack, it's thick.

Pisang goreng

The Southeast-Asian street food Pisang Goreng (also known as Goreng Pisang) is popular in Malaysia and Indonesia. Pisang Goreng literally translates as "fried bananas," but don't be fooled by the term. A batter is used to coat sweet, ripe bananas, which are then deep-fried till golden brown.



Rojak buah

The fruit salad rojak buah is popular in Indonesia, Malaysia, and Singapore. This salad is popular in Malaysia, for example, in Penang. In colloquial Malay, the word 'rojak' implies mixture,' whereas 'buah' denotes 'fruits.' The standout element in this fruit salad is a unique shrimp paste.

Siew pao

Although the fluffy white siew pao is usually steamed, you can also find ones with a crispy baked exterior filled with savoury meat filling of either pork and chicken seasoned with oyster sauce, dark soya sauce and 5-spice powder. Additionally, there are sweet flavours available such as red bean and kaya.

Murukku

Murukku is a salty, crispy delicacy that originated in the Indian subcontinent. Murukku is derived from the Tamil term "twisted," which alludes to the form of the fruit. Rice flour and urad dal flour are used to make murukku. Chakli is a similar dish that uses bengal gramme (chickpea) flour as a supplementary ingredient.

Must-try Eats in KL (Dessert)

Cendol

Cendol is an iced sweet delicacy made of green rice flour jelly droplets, coconut milk, and palm sugar syrup. Southeast Asia is where you'll find it most often. Additional toppings, such as chopped jackfruit, sweetened red azuki beans, or durian, can be placed on top of the green jelly.

Ais kacang

Ais kacang, which literally means "bean ice," and is also known as ABC, is a popular Malaysian delicacy. Traditionally, an ice shaving machine, which was formerly hand-cranked but is now more commonly motorised, is used to churn out the shaved ice used in the dessert.



Kuih lapis

Kue lapis is a classic Indonesian kue, or steamed colourful tiered soft rice flour pudding. Lapis means "layers" in Indonesian. This steamed tiered sticky rice cake or pudding is popular in Indonesia, Suriname, and the Netherlands, where colonial ties have brought it there.

Bentong is split into three mukim (sub-districts), Mukim Bentong, Mukim Sabai, and Mukim Pelangai, all of which are administered by the Bentong Municipal Council.

This town serves as the district's administrative and industrial hub. This region is home to a variety of small and medium-sized businesses, including sawmills, food production, and a facility that collects electrical components. Increased urban growth had enlightened the Bentong Municipal Council in its efforts to turn Bentong Town into a developed, prosperous, and serene urban region by planning for future demands and difficulties.

In Genting visitors will get a firsthand look at how the bee farm operates, as a colony of bees forages for sweet nectar on its own, with no human involvement or aid. Imagine the pure natural deliciousness of honey generated from a huge genus of flora and fauna that can only be found abundantly in a rainforest that is rapidly diminishing in numbers, and it is filled with high proteins and nutrients in the Highlands.

Ipoh is the capital of Perak, Malaysia, and is situated on the Kinta River. Ipoh has a population of 657,892 people in 2010, making it Malaysia's fourth most populous city. Ipoh, which started off as a hamlet, grew dramatically in the 1880s after massive tin reserves were discovered nearby. It was the second biggest city in the Federated Malay States, which included Selangor, Negeri Sembilan, and Pahang, by 1895. Tambun Pomelo

During the Chinese New Year, the pomelo fruit is in high demand. Pomelo and grapefruit are quite similar since they both come from the same citrus family. The larger fruit has more luscious pulp and is less bitter than the grapefruit. There are basically two flavours to select from: sweet or sour. The majority will choose the sweet flavour, but others may prefer the sour flavour.



Ipoh White Coffee

Ipoh white coffee is a famous coffee drink that originated in Ipoh, Perak, Malaysia, and has earned Ipoh the title of one of the top three coffee in the city. The coffee beans are roasted with palm oil margarine and served with sweetened condensed milk. The nickname 'white coffee' comes from the exact translation of the Chinese word for the beverage, which was introduced in the 19th century by Chinese migrants working in the local tin mines. The colour comes from the milk that is mixed into the finished product, not from the coffee beans themselves.



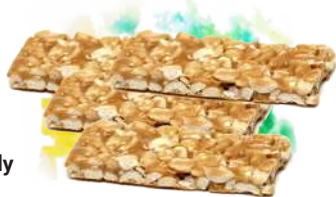
Meat Floss Biscuits

Meat Floss Biscuits, also known as rousong, yuk sang, or bak hu, are a dried meat product originated from China with a light and fluffy texture akin to coarse cotton. Meat Floss Biscuits is a savoury soy milk that is used to top a variety of meals, including congee, tofu, rice, and savoury soy milk. It's also used as a filling for savoury buns and pastries, as well as a topping for baked products filled with bean paste, and as a standalone snack item.



Caramel Egg Custard

Kampar nicknamed Education City is the largest town of the eponymous Kampar District, Perak, Malaysia. Founded in 1887, the town lies within the Kinta Valley, an area rich with tin reserves. It was a tin mining town which boomed during the height of the tin mining industry. Many tin towns were established in the late 19th century, flourished in the 1900s, only to stagnate and decline after World War I, with the exception of an exhilarating boom in the 1920s. Most have closed down following the collapse of the industry, especially in the late 20th century. White Coffee Smoothie

White coffee is coffee that has been roasted half way and at a lower temperature. You get a whitish coloured bean that is stronger in caffeine by roasting it to this much lower temperature because you roast out less caffeine. Tau Fu Fah

Tau Foo Fah (Soy Bean Pudding) is a silken tofu dish served with a clear sweet syrup flavoured with ginger or pandan (brown syrup is occasionally substituted for clear syrup). It's best served warm, but it's also great cold. Tau Foo Fah was once only available from street sellers, but it is now available as part of the dim sum menu at Chinese restaurants.



Kampar Biscuits

There is no chicken or chicken flavour in the chicken biscuit. Sesame seeds, garlic, pepper, and other ingredients are used to make it. Before purchasing, you can test both the thick and thin types to see which one you like. Other biscuits include "Hong Piah," a sweet pastry with caramel fillings, and "Egg Biscuit," which is sweet and sticky.



Roast Chicken Rice

Roast Chicken Rice is created with delicate poached chicken chopped into bite-size pieces, aromatic and flavorful rice, and dipping sauces such as dark soya sauce, garlic-chilli, and ginger. Chicken Rice is flavorful and fragrant. The rice grains are cooked in chicken fat oil with garlic and sesame seeds. Chickens are hand-picked for their flesh and flavour.



Egg Tart

The egg tart is a custard tart that originated in Cantonese cuisine and is a cross between the English custard tart and the Portuguese pastel de nata. The dish is made up of an exterior pastry crust and an egg custard filling.



Curry Chicken Bread

Curry has a distinct flavor and aroma due to the blend of sweet and savory spices that make up its composition. The rich earthy taste comes from savory spices like cumin and bay leaf, while the cloves and cinnamon add freshness. Now add them with bread, there are a feast you can get as a snack

Laksa

In Southeast Asia, laksa is a spicy noodle meal. Laksa is made out of a variety of noodles, the most common of which are thick rice noodles, with toppings such as chicken, prawns, or fish. A thick and spicy coconut soup or a broth seasoned with sour asam are used in most laksa varieties.



Mee Rebus

Nyonya Beaded Shoes

The beaded slippers were popular in the 1930s and were worn by both Peranakan males (baba) and girls (nyonya). Beaded slippers are increasingly often worn by women these days. The beaded slippers were designed to be worn for two different occasions. These beaded shoes were used for joyous events like the Chinese New Year or birthdays, and they employed multicoloured beads with complex designs.



Dodol

Dodol, which originated in Melaka, is a brown sticky candy that tastes like toffee and is made from coconut milk and rice flour. If you're looking for something more exotic, try the tropical durian or pandan flavour. This is a must-buy snack for those with a sweet tooth, and is often molded into cute pyramids.



Pineapple Tart

The pineapple tarts in Melaka are more savoury and crusty than those seen elsewhere. The jam part itself is typically positioned in either a rolled form or left open within a flower molded base. Among the most well-known stalls are Sam Shu Gong, Pooh Keon, and Nyonya Story Enterprise. Prices vary, but handmade items are preferable to those produced in factories.

Kacang tumbuk is a Malay term for "punched peanuts," which refers to a thin peanut cookie or dessert. The nuts are pounded and formed into square bite-sized biscuits until they are mixed with sugar. 
Nyonya Kuih

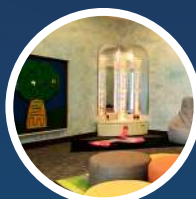
