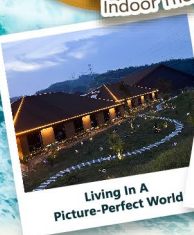

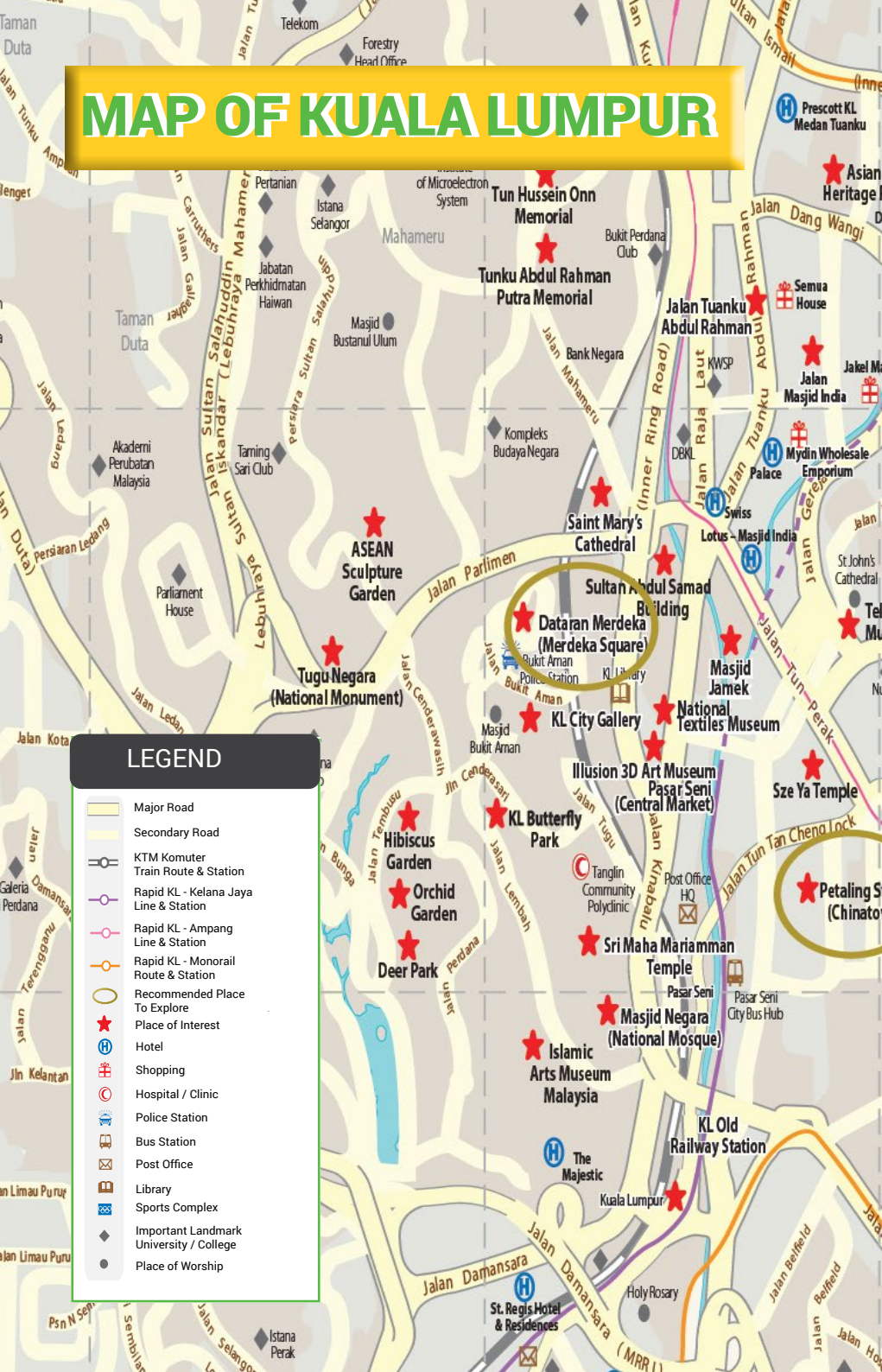

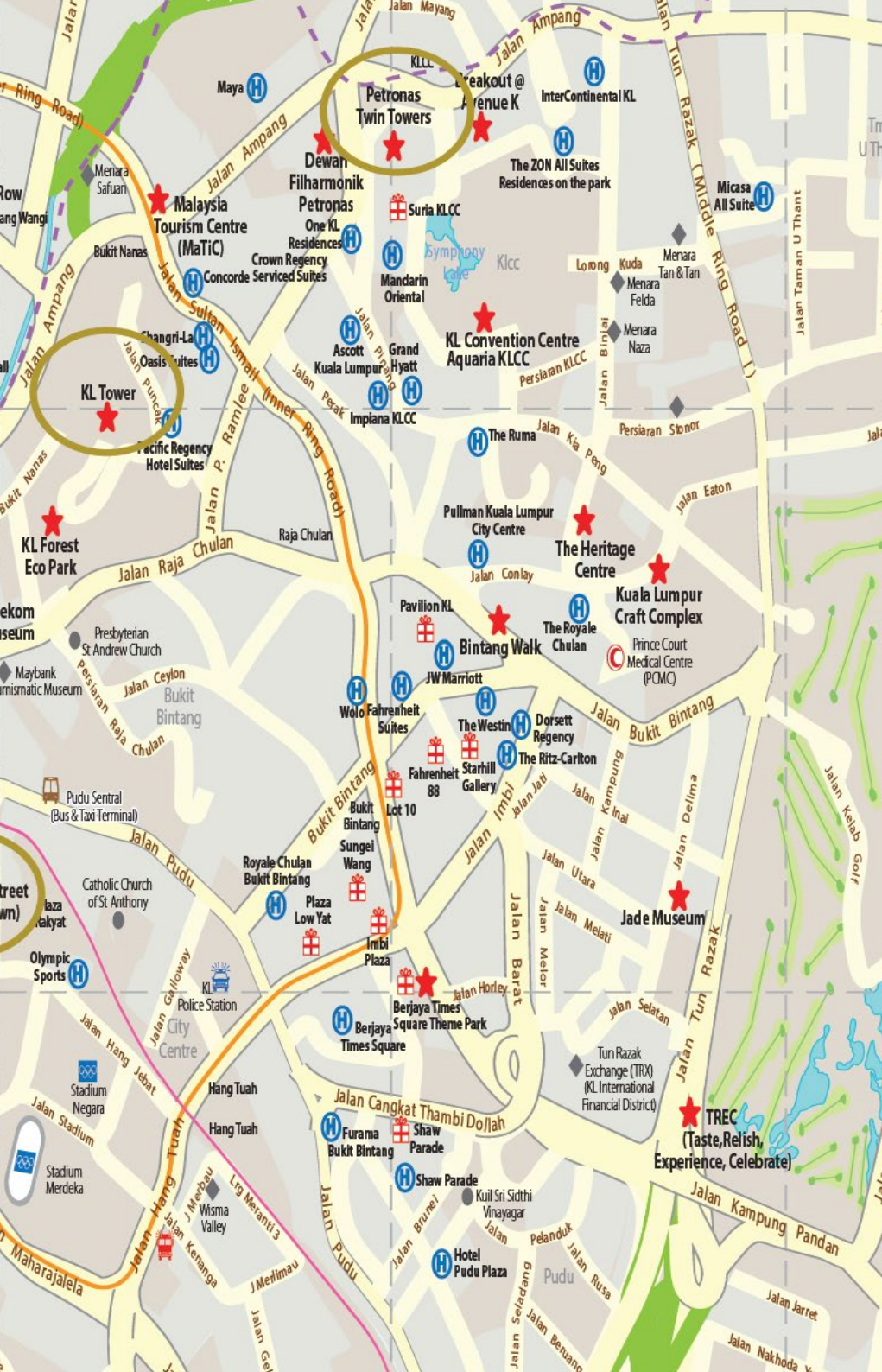


# MAP OF KUALA LUMPUR

# TRANSPORTATION

## FROM KLIA & KLIA2

Getting between the airport and the city in Kuala Lumpur is surprisingly simple, with a variety of travel options to suit every budget and preference. For those seeking affordability, the Airport Coach and AeroBus are great choices, offering fares between RM10 and RM14 and operating regularly throughout the day.

If speed and convenience are your priorities, the KLIA Ekspres train is a perfect pick, whisking passengers to KLIA or KLIA 2 in just 35 to 40 minutes. It runs daily from early morning to midnight, with tickets priced at RM55. Groups can enjoy a 25% discount, making it even more cost-effective.

For a more private and direct option, taxis are available but come with fares ranging from RM80 to RM200. Alternatively, Grab provides a middle-ground solution, offering comfortable rides at fixed rates starting from RM65.

No matter which option you choose, traveling between the airport and city is designed to be efficient, stress-free, and convenient.

## FROM PENANG INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

Planning a trip from Penang to Kuala Lumpur? Flying from Penang Airport to KLIA takes just an hour, with ticket prices starting at RM70 and reaching over RM650, depending on your preferences. For a budget-friendly alternative, consider taking a bus, with fares ranging from RM50 to RM60. The journey by bus takes approximately 7 to 8 hours. If you prefer driving, expect an average travel time of around 6 hours, though heavy traffic could extend the duration.

## FROM LANGKAWI INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

Traveling from Langkawi International Airport to KLIA takes just over an hour, with ticket prices ranging from RM160 to RM200. For a shorter flight, you can opt for a trip to Subang Airport, which takes approximately 58 minutes. Alternatively, if you prefer a scenic route, consider taking a bus that includes a ferry ride from the island, with fares between RM118 and RM176 per person.

## FROM SUBANG SKYPARK TERMINAL

If you're heading from KL Sentral to Subang Airport, take advantage of the SKYPARK Link's special promotion, with one-way tickets from Subang Airport to Kuala Lumpur priced at just RM3.50. Offering 32 daily trips with departures every 30 to 60 minutes, the SKYPARK Link ensures a fast and hassle-free journey. Enjoy unbeatable value and efficiency with the SKYPARK Link service.

## FROM KOTA KINABALU INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

For a journey from Sabah to Kuala Lumpur, flying is the preferred choice. Flights from Kota Kinabalu International Airport (KKIA) to KLIA take around 2 hours and 25 minutes. Ticket prices typically range from RM380 to RM1,380, depending on the airline and booking time.

## FROM KUCHING INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

Planning a flight from Kuching to Kuala Lumpur? The journey typically takes about 2 hours and 45 minutes. Located 11 kilometers south of Kuching's city center, Kuching International Airport offers flights to KL operated by airlines like Malaysia Airlines, AirAsia, and Malindo Air. Ticket prices range from RM289 to RM581, depending on your choice of airline and travel dates.

## Train

## Bus

Up for the thrill ? There are plenty of comfortable and budget buses available ! A bus trip from KLIA to the city center usually took about 1 hour and 15 minutes but it may depend on the traffic. Worry about tickets ? Worry no more when there are RapidKL buses that connect you to MRT, LRT and Monorail Stations, therefore going around from place to place is easier and cost effective. Wanted free rides? Look out for Go KL, Smart Selangor and PJ City, making your journey even more better.



## Taxi

Looking for an experienced driver to bring you around ? Taxis are still an option for getting around. Although the demand on taxis nowadays is less popular compared with e-hailing services, you can surely get one to the city center. But before getting a taxi it is highly recommended to negotiate with the driver and ensure that they are using metres to avoid unwanted charges. The starting fare is about RM 3, with an extra charge of RM0.20 for every 150 meters travelled. Be safe and happy travelling !

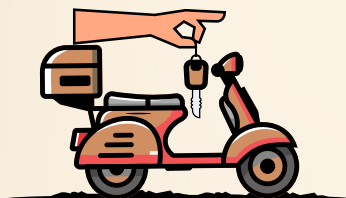

# KUALA LUMPUR

Kuala Lumpur, the vibrant capital of Malaysia, is the nation's largest urban area and a thriving hub for culture, commerce, and transportation. Spanning approximately 243 square kilometers, this dynamic city is experiencing rapid population growth and economic prosperity. Ranked as the ninth most visited city in the world, it captivates millions of travelers with its unique blend of modernity and tradition. Located where the Gombak and Klang Rivers intersect, Kuala Lumpur derives its name from the Malay term meaning "muddy estuary," reflecting its early beginnings. Positioned about 300 kilometers northwest of Singapore and 40 kilometers east of the Strait of Malacca, the city benefits from a strategic geographical location. With its iconic skyline, featuring landmarks like the Petronas Twin Towers, a thriving arts and cultural scene, and a warm, inviting atmosphere, Kuala Lumpur offers visitors an unforgettable experience. The city's vibrancy and charm ensure it remains a must-visit destination for travelers worldwide.

# HISTORY OF KUALA LUMPUR

The name “Kuala Lumpur,” which translates to “muddy estuary” in Malay, was given by tin miners who arrived in Ampang and discovered the junction of the Gombak and Klang Rivers. They named the area Kuala Lumpur to reflect its location at this natural meeting point. Here is a chronological overview of Kuala Lumpur’s historical journey:

**1857**

A group of 87 tin miners uncovered rich tin deposits in Ampang, sparking the first wave of development in the area as they ventured into the region near Kuala Lumpur.

**1862**

Kuala Lumpur experienced a population surge, accompanied by an increase in conflicts, disputes, and intense gang rivalries, as its rapid growth attracted a flood of miners seeking fortune.

**1869**

Yap Ah Loy, a prominent leader of the Chinese community, played a pivotal role in founding Kuala Lumpur’s first school and a shelter for the destitute. He also became a key figure in establishing law and order in the growing city.

**1880**

British official Frank Sweetenham laid the groundwork for Kuala Lumpur’s future by unveiling a grand urban blueprint to transform it into a modern metropolis.

**1887**

Kuala Lumpur reached a significant milestone in its development when it was officially designated as the capital of Selangor.

**1896**

The importance of Kuala Lumpur on the national stage was solidified when it earned its status as the capital of the Federated Malay States as a result of the consolidation of the four state sultans.

**1910**

Kuala Lumpur’s first railway station was designed and constructed under the architectural vision of Arthur Benison Hubback. It became a key piece of infrastructure, linking the city to the broader region.

**1942**

World War II marked a difficult chapter in Kuala Lumpur’s rich history when the city was occupied by Japanese forces.



Kuala Lumpur marked a pivotal moment in its growing influence when it was designated as the capital of the Malayan Federation.

After 151 years under British colonial rule, with great joy Malaysia celebrated its Independence Day.

As the city adapted to rapid urban growth, Kuala Lumpur faced unique administrative challenges with a population of around 500,000.

Kuala Lumpur solidified its central role in the nation's governance when it was officially named the capital of Malaysia.

The city's social landscape was reshaped by a significant civil conflict between the Chinese and Malay communities, sparked by rising ethnic tensions.

Kuala Lumpur became the first municipality in Malaysia to achieve city status after gaining independence, marking a prestigious milestone.

Kuala Lumpur established its own local government when it was designated as a Federal Territory.

A wave of modernization, extending beyond Kuala Lumpur to the entire nation, was propelled under the visionary leadership of Prime Minister Dr. Mahathir, with the launch of the "Vision 2020" initiative.

A new chapter in Malaysia's administrative evolution began when the federal administrative capital was moved to Putrajaya.

## **10 FUN FACTS ABOUT KUALA LUMPUR**

### **Meaning of Kuala Lumpur**

The name “Kuala Lumpur” is derived from the Malay language, where “kuala” means “confluence” and “lumpur” translates to “mud.” The story of Kuala Lumpur began in 1857, when a determined group of 87 Chinese tin miners ventured into the surrounding areas of Ampang. They established a settlement at the junction where the Gombak and Klang rivers meet, giving rise to a thriving town that would eventually be named Kuala Lumpur. This evocative name captures the essence of the city’s origin at the confluence of these two rivers.

### **Home To The Second Tallest Tower in the World**

The Petronas Twin Towers, once the world’s tallest structure, were among Malaysia’s tallest structures until they were surpassed by the recently completed Merdeka 118.



### **World’s Tallest Twin Towers is in KL**

For years, the Petronas Twin Towers symbolized Kuala Lumpur’s skyline and national pride, with their striking design and soaring height. They held the title of the world’s tallest building from 1998 until 2004, when Taipei 101 surpassed them. These iconic towers remained Malaysia’s tallest architectural marvel

### **The Malaysian King lives in KL@ Istana Negara**

The grand residence of the Yang di-Pertuan Agong, known as Istana Negara or the National Palace, stands along Jalan Tuanku Abdul Halim (formerly Jalan Duta) in the heart of Kuala Lumpur. This majestic palace serves as the official residence of Malaysia’s king, embodying regal splendor and national significance within the vibrant cityscape of Kuala Lumpur.





### **Kuala Lumpur is ranked 8th best city for expats globally (3rd in Asia)**

Malaysia follows a political framework characterized by a constitutional monarchy and parliamentary democracy. Under this system, the King acts as the symbolic head of state, while the parliament holds significant authority in maintaining democratic values and overseeing governance.

### **KL Tower is the 7th tallest telecommunication tower in the world**

Rising majestically above Kuala Lumpur, the KL Tower stands as the world's seventh tallest communication tower, its sleek spire piercing the skyline and symbolizing Malaysia's growing prominence in global architectural achievements.



### **Yang di-Pertuan Agong is an Elected Monarch**

In Malaysia, the Yang di-Pertuan Agong is elected through a complex selection process governed by the Constitution's Third Schedule and the Conference of Rulers' Regulations. As such, our sovereign does not reign as an absolute monarch, but as an elected head of state. Every five years, the Yang di-Pertuan Agong is chosen from among the Sultans (or monarchs) of the Malaysian states through a unique rotational system, with the selection taking place during a ceremonial assembly of the Malay rulers.

### **Malaysian Government is in Putrajaya**

In contrast to the conventional model of housing all government functions within the main capital, Malaysia has designated three meticulously planned cities—Kuala Lumpur, Putrajaya, and Labuan—as its Federal Territory (Wilayah Persekutuan), with each serving a distinct role within the government. As a result, Putrajaya was chosen as the administrative and judicial epicenter. Today, Putrajaya stands as the nation's vibrant hub for governmental affairs, home to numerous key offices and institutions.







## KL is The Retail and Fashion Hub of Malaysia

Kuala Lumpur is the heart of Malaysia's shopping malls, which is home to over 350 retail havens nationwide. The city's malls are the ultimate destination for shoppers and fashion enthusiasts, offering a treasure trove of style and elegance. ## Malay

## Chinese

The Chinese community makes up 22.4% of Malaysia's population, making it the second-largest ethnic group in the country. Primarily descended from migrants from Southern China who arrived between the early 19th and mid-20th centuries, Malaysian Chinese represent the world's second-largest overseas Chinese population, after the Thai Chinese. They speak a variety of Chinese dialects, including Hokkien, Hainanese, Cantonese, and Hakka.

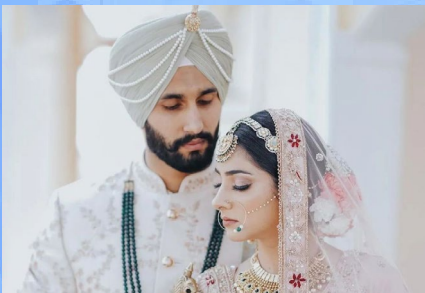
## Indian

Various other languages, including Tamil, Malayalam, Punjabi, Bengali, Pashto, and Sinhalese, are also spoken by them. Deepavali is the most colourful festival in Malaysia, where Hindus celebrate by tracing designs and figures on the ground and covering them with coloured rice.

Sikhs represent the fourth-largest ethnic group in Malaysia, with Klang serving as a major cultural hub. A key landmark is the Gurdwara Sahib Klang, a prominent Sikh place of worship. The community celebrates Vaisakhi with traditions such as the renewal of the Nishan Sahib and shared communal meals. Sikhs have also enriched Malaysia's cultural landscape by introducing the vibrant Bhangra dance and Boliyan folk songs.

## Maggi Goreng

“Maggi goreng extra telur satu” Malaysian favorite dish no matter what time of the day. The stir-frying Maggi instant noodles with the rich savory combination of spices, sauces, and fresh ingredients, often served with a fried egg on top will definitely blow your mind. Whether you’re having it for breakfast, lunch, or a late-night snack, Maggi Goreng is a go-to comfort food that has become a staple in Malaysian street food culture.



## Asam laksa

The dish laksa has Peranakan roots. Laksa comes in a huge variety of flavors. Asam laksa comes in numerous variations, just in Malaysia. This Penang asam laksa is one of the must-try dishes when you are in Malaysia. It is a fish-based soup asam laksa that is sweet and tangy. It includes tamarind flavor, which is frequently used to give this stock its sour flavor, which is known by the Malay word ‘asam’. The flavor of Asam Laksa is quite complex, combining umami, sweet, sour, and spice.



## Char Kuey Teow

Char Kuey Teow is a stir-fried rice noodle dish originating from southern China. ‘Char’ means stir-fried and ‘kway teow’ means flat rice noodles in Hokkien and Teochew. Besides the plain roti canai (roti kosong), it comes with many other types such as Roti Telur, Roti Tisu, Roti Bom, Roti Tampal and many more. You’d be surprised with the variety of roti canai we have in Malaysia! This dish can be easily found in any Mamak stall in Malaysia.

## Nasi Kandar



Nasi Kandar is a beloved Malaysian dish, featuring steamed rice paired with an assortment of flavorful curries and side dishes, including different types of meats, seafood, and vegetables. The fun part? You get to choose your own combination, drenching the rice with rich, spicy curries for a mouth-watering mix of flavors. The price depends on how much you load up your plate, so it's perfect whether you're going light or diving in for a feast. It's a must-try experience that truly reflects Malaysia's love for bold and hearty food!

## Nasi lemak



A type of rice that has been cooked in coconut milk with pandan leaf with a variety of side dishes such as "Sambal Sotong, Paru, Ayam Goreng, Rendang and many more. Nasi Lemak is known as the national dish of Malaysia. It is a Malaysian routine to have Nasi Lemak before starting their day off. It is so versatile that it can be enjoyed at any time of the day. Whether at humble roadside stalls or upscale restaurants in shopping malls, this beloved dish is easily found all across the country.

## Nasi Kerabu



Nasi Kerabu is a beautiful Kelantanese dish that stands out with its striking blue rice, naturally dyed using butterfly pea flowers (bunga telang). It's usually served with grilled fish, grilled beef, fried chicken, salted eggs, fresh herbs, and a spicy sambal, giving you a mix of flavors and textures in every bite. Add a dash of budu (fermented fish sauce) and some spiced fish floss, and you've got a dish that's as refreshing as it is delicious—a true taste of Malaysia's heritage!

## Chee Cheong Fun



Chee Cheong Fun is a Cantonese dish made up of rice noodle roll. It is a thin roll packed with shrimp, meat, veggies, or other items and it is made up of shahe fen. This dish is mostly eaten with yong tau foo on the side and is drizzled with soy sauce, sesame seeds, and green onion. This dish can be easily found in any Chinese dim sum shops or at other hawker stalls.

## Bah Kut Teh



Bah Kut Teh is a popular and hearty Chinese dish, loved by Malaysian Chinese. The name translates to "meat bone tea", though interestingly, there's no tea in the dish itself. Instead, it refers to the strong, flavorful broth often enjoyed alongside Chinese tea, which is believed to help balance the meal's rich flavors. Often served with rice, youtiao (fried dough) and tea.

# SNACKS

## Apam Balik



Apam Balik is a tasty snack that is cooked until golden brown and filled with crushed peanuts, sugar, and sweet corn. It comes in two types: thick and soft or thin and crispy, varying by vendor. Commonly found at night markets, food stalls, and festivals, it holds a special place in Malaysian food culture. Try it if you are not allergic to peanuts.

## Cakoi



It is a long, golden-brown snack made of fried dough. Cakoi can be enjoyed in two different ways. The Chinese way- with coffee, rice porridge or soybeans or The Malays way- with Pandan sauce as a dip. It is best to consume Cakoi while it is still hot, if not it will be soggy !

## Keropok Lekor



This popular snack, especially in the East Coast regions like Terengganu and Kelantan, is a fish cracker made from fish formed into long sticks. They are often steamed or boiled and then deep-fried until golden and crispy. The snack has a chewy inside and a crispy outside. It is commonly served with a spicy-sweet chili sauce or a tangy vinegar dip to add flavor, but it can also be enjoyed plain.

## Murtabak



It is a type of stuffed flatbread, filled with a mixture of spiced minced meat (usually beef or chicken), eggs and onions, before being pan-fried to golden perfection. The Malaysian version of Murtabak is often served with a pickled onion, enhancing its rich flavors. Originally influenced by Indian and Arabian cuisine, Murtabak has become a popular street food and is widely available at food stalls, pasar malam (night markets) and Bazar Ramadan during Ramadan.

## Rojak Buah



The word "rojak" means "mix" in Malay, which suits this dish well. It typically includes crunchy fruits like pineapple, green mango, jicama, cucumber, and sometimes young papaya or rose apple. Rojak Buah is special because of its bold sauce, made from shrimp paste, sugar, lime juice, and chili, often topped with ground roasted peanuts and sesame seeds. It's popular at hawker stalls, food courts, and night markets in Malaysia, providing a refreshing taste of the country's culinary heritage.

# DESSERTS

## Seri Muka

This traditional Malaysian kuih features a bright green pandan custard layer above a base of steamed glutinous rice. It is rich, creamy, and sweet, with the flavors of pandan and coconut milk. Popular during tea time and as a snack, Seri Muka highlights Malaysian culinary traditions using simple, local ingredients. It can often be found at night markets, street vendors, or selected restaurants.



## Cendol Durian

The text describes a variation of the traditional dessert cendol, which includes the same ingredients like shaved ice, green pandan-flavored cendol jelly, coconut milk, and palm sugar syrup, but adds fresh durian. This addition of durian, known as the “King of Fruits,” enhances the flavor and makes the dessert more indulgent. Cendol durian is especially popular in Malaysia during the durian season, providing a refreshing treat in the tropical heat. It is recommended to try this dish when visiting Kuala Lumpur.



## ABC

Air Batu Campur, or ABC, is a popular and sweet dessert in Malaysia, especially enjoyed on hot days. It consists of shaved ice soaked in sweet syrups like rose, sarsaparilla, or palm sugar. ABC is topped with various ingredients like red beans, sweet corn, grass jelly, peanuts, and sometimes even ice cream. For extra sweetness, it often gets a drizzle of condensed milk or chocolate syrup. You can find ABC at many hawker stalls, food courts, and some restaurants.



## Kuih Badak Berendam

Kuih Badak Berendam is a traditional Malay dessert that resembles mochi in texture. It consists of glutinous rice flour dumplings soaked in coconut milk sauce. The dumplings are filled with a sweet mixture of grated coconut, palm sugar, and pandan leaves, creating a fragrant flavor. Typically enjoyed during tea-time, this dessert can be found at Malay stalls.



## Goreng Pisang

Banana lovers will enjoy Goreng Pisang, or banana fritters, a simple and tasty snack. They have a crispy, crunchy outside and a soft, sweet banana inside. The best bananas to use are Pisang Raja, Pisang Tanduk, or Pisang Awak because they are sweet and firm. For extra sweetness, ask for very ripe bananas. You can find these fritters at roadside stalls, and they pair well with hot tea or coffee.

## Ice Cream Malaysia



This nostalgic treat comes in a variety of flavors and the famous ones are Milo or Sirap Bandung. This quick and mess-free ice cream comes in plastic tubes where you can have it while walking or standing. You may bite off the end or you may ask for a scissors to cut the top of it. Grab it for the perfect treat under the sunny weather of Kuala Lumpur.

## Tau Foo Fah



Classic Malaysian dessert, this silky tofu pudding combined with a sweet syrup or palm sugar (gula Melaka) will create a mindblowing taste on your tastebuds. It's a local favorite and it can be enjoyed warm or cold. Come and grab a bowl from street vendors because you can't get it elsewhere.

## Laddu



Laddu, or Ladoo, is a popular Indian sweet often associated with celebrations, festivals, and religious rituals. Made from ingredients like gram flour, semolina, or coconut mixed with ghee, sugar, and aromatic spices such as cardamom, it is rolled into small, flavorful balls. Variants like Motichoor Laddu and Besan Laddu are especially loved for their unique textures and rich taste. Often offered as prasad in temples or enjoyed during Deepavali and weddings or you can get it at selected Indian restaurants.

## Bubur Pulut Hitam



Bubur Pulut Hitam is a beloved Malaysian dessert made from black glutinous rice cooked with pandan leaves, sugar, and water to create a thick porridge. Coconut milk is added for a creamy richness. Often served warm or chilled, it's a comforting treat with a slight nutty flavor. The dish is not only delicious but also nutritious, thanks to the health benefits of black glutinous rice.

# KL - PUTRAJAYA

The journey between Kuala Lumpur and Putrajaya offers two main routes, each with distinct advantages depending on your location in KL and traffic conditions. The most common and widely used route is via the North-South Expressway (E1). Starting from central Kuala Lumpur, you will head south, merging onto the E1, a major highway that connects various cities in Malaysia, including Putrajaya. While this route is relatively straightforward, it can be slower during peak hours due to higher traffic volumes, especially as it passes through areas with frequent interchanges and toll plazas. Typically, travel time via this route ranges from 30 to 40 minutes, depending on traffic. On the other hand, the Maju Expressway (MEX) offers a more direct and faster option. The MEX is a modern, toll-based road that connects KL to Putrajaya, bypassing many of the typical traffic bottlenecks found on other routes. The expressway leads you directly into Putrajaya with fewer intersections and traffic lights, which often makes it a more time-efficient choice. Travel time on the MEX is usually around 25 to 30 minutes, making it the preferred route for those seeking a quicker journey. Both routes are well-maintained, clearly signposted, and relatively easy to navigate, but it's important to consider peak traffic hours, as these can significantly affect travel time. For the smoothest experience, checking real-time traffic updates is always advisable before setting off.

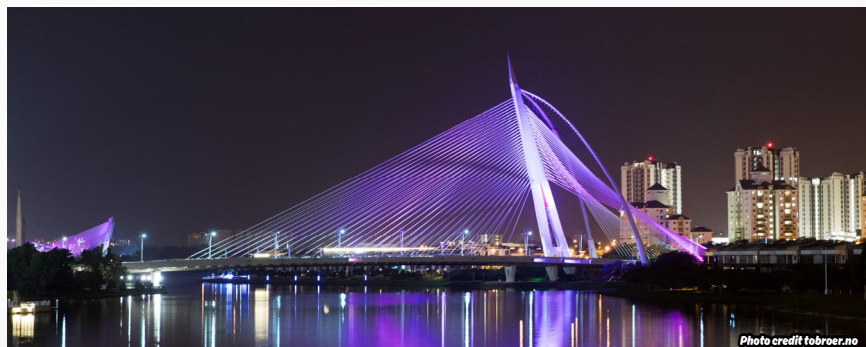

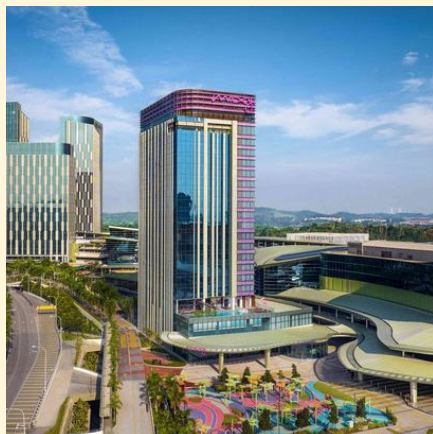

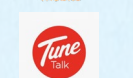
